On Remembrance Day - Remember *all* the victims of war

White Poppies are to remember all victims of all wars, including victims of wars that are still being fought. This includes people of all nationalities. It includes both civil-



ians and members of armed forces. Today, over 90% of people killed in warfare are civilians.

The British Legion say that Red Poppies are to remember only British armed forces and those who fought alongside them, so many people wear the two Poppies together to show that civilians and even 'enemy combatants' are remembered too.
